ACCP LAUNCHES COMMUNITY-BASED PRN

ACCP officially welcomes its newest PRN – the Community-Based Practice and Research Network – which was formally approved by the ACCP Board of Regents on July 28. Community-based pharmacy practitioners face many unique challenges, including practice management topics such as appointment-based scheduling, medication synchronization, and eCare plan review and documentation, as well as point-of-care testing, immunizations, and naloxone prescribing. The new PRN will focus on supporting community-based practitioners' needs for unique programming, research, and collaboration.

More than 125 ACCP members responded to a recent survey gauging interest in forming a practice and research network in the community-based area. The survey was initiated by the ACCP Community-Based Pharmacy Advisory Panel. Members of the panel include Cody Clifton, Kelly Cochran, Stefanie Ferreri, Caitlin Frail, Melissa Somma McGivney, and Margie Snyder. Snyder subsequently submitted the application for the new PRN on behalf of the ACCP members responding to the survey. In announcing the board's approval of the formation of the Community-Based PRN, ACCP President Jimmi Hatton Kolpek stressed the importance of the new PRN to ACCP, its members, and their patients.

Community-based members are at the forefront of health equity challenges affecting diverse populations. The programming, research, and practice initiatives from this PRN [will] create networking opportunities and extend our understanding of factors affecting inclusive health care goals across the care continuum.

Snyder is an associate professor of pharmacy practice at the Purdue University College of Pharmacy and a member of the Department of Pharmacy Practice's Community Pharmacy Advancement Committee. In this role, she established the Medication Safety Research Network of Indiana (Rx-SafeNet), a state-wide practice-based research network of community pharmacies. She directs Purdue's Community Practice Research Fellowship Program and serves as a preceptor for the PGY1 community pharmacy residencies affiliated with the college. In addition, she serves as a faculty practice transformation coach to Team Indiana for the Flip the Pharmacy Program. Snyder, who also serves as founding chair of the PRN, talked about potential activities and near-term goals for the new PRN.

I am thrilled by the board's approval of the new Community-Based Practice and Research Network and am excited to connect with ACCP members at the Annual Meeting in October for networking and further discussion. I am looking forward to leading this PRN in developing community-focused programming and research development and collaboration efforts.

2022 Futures Grants: Mentored Research Awards

The ACCP Foundation's Futures Grants program for *student*, *trainee*, *and early-career ACCP members* is designed to support the development of research skills and establish sustained interest and careers in pharmacy research. The amount of Futures Grants awards ranges from \$5,000 to \$40,000, depending on applicant eligibility and budget approval. Up to \$100,000 in mentored, developmental research awards is expected to be distributed through the 2022 Futures Grants program.

The next grant application cycle will open May 15, 2022, and completed applications will be due no later than September 1, 2022. Grants will be reviewed and scored by translational category of the research in addition to the applicant's eligibility level. The 2021 Futures Grants application period closed September 1, and award recipients will be announced by November 15, 2021.

Investigator Development

The Foundation's research development programs returned in 2021, after the pandemic forced cancellations in June 2020. In June 2021, 30 participating mentees and mentors spent a productive week crafting and refining research projects and grant applications.

Mentored Research Investigator Training (MeRIT) Program

This one-of-a-kind training program is designed to help pharmacists develop the abilities necessary to conduct investigator-initiated research, either independently as a principal investigator or actively as a co-investigator within a research team. Ideal candidates for the MeRIT Program are pharmacy faculty or practitioners with limited research experience who are:

- Committed to incorporating research into their professional careers;
- Interested in generating research themes or obtaining preliminary data for larger funding opportunities;
- Aspiring to be active principal investigators or coinvestigators within a research team.

MeRIT is a 2-year longitudinal program that uses a combination of live and virtual teaching and mentoring methods to provide trainees with the support and education they need throughout the research experience (i.e., from idea, proposal development, funding application, and project completion to presentation and publication).

The application period for the 2022 MeRIT Program will open in November 2021, with letters of intent due February 28, 2022, and full applications due March 31, 2022. The primer program will be held June 13–17, 2022, on the campus of the University of Kentucky College of Pharmacy in Lexington.

Focused Investigator Training (FIT) Program

The Foundation's flagship pharmacist investigator training program will also continue June 13–17, 2022, at the University of Kentucky College of Pharmacy in Lexington. If you plan to submit (or resubmit) a research proposal to the NIH or other major foundation/organization funding source, FIT should be on your agenda.

This 5-day, intensive, hands-on program has a strong history of participant success, as it pairs experienced and funded faculty mentors with investigator-participants. The program is geared to fine-tune R-type investigator-initiated proposals and K-type career development awards. The ideal applicant is a mid-career, fellowship-trained, tenure-track or research-focused pharmacist. The application period for the 2022 FIT Program will open in November 2021, with letters of intent due February 28, 2022, and full applications due March 31, 2022.

Advancing the Profession by Influencing Policy: ACCP's Advocacy Efforts Beyond Capitol Hill

The global COVID-19 pandemic has produced a prolonged period of uncertainty and high demand for health care, exposing gaps in the health care system and a workforce shortage. This learning session at the 2021 Virtual ACCP Member Meeting on Saturday, October 16, from 1:30 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. CDT will provide an overview of key legislative opportunities to leverage the pharmacy workforce (e.g., Public Readiness and Emergency Preparedness [PREP] Act and 1135 waivers), during the ongoing public health emergency.

Although advocacy sessions initially focused on emergency and acute care resources, improving chronic and complex care management is now of particular importance in reducing hospitalizations and lessening the risk of underlying conditions.

Through active discussion with expert panelists, attendees will evaluate the potential impact of comprehensive medication management (CMM) on chronic care

management and acquire advocacy resources for advancing clinical pharmacist integration into team-based care models consistent with implementing the Social Security Act, MACRA, and the Quality Payment Program.

These resources will include the Implementing High-Quality Primary Care report from the National Academies (NASEM) as well as reports from the Get the Medications Right (GTMRx) Institute. Speakers will summarize these resources, and panelists will discuss how they can be applied to advocate for payment and policy reform and engage key stakeholders. This knowledge-based activity is available for 1.5 hours of continuing pharmacy education credit.

Coverage for Services: Why Provider Status Alone Is Not the Solution

For as long as ACCP has operated a Washington office, the omission of pharmacists from the list of "eligible providers" under <u>section 1861</u> of the Social Security Act has been viewed by the wider pharmacy profession as the single greatest barrier to securing payment for services. That's why, as far back as 2003, ACCP has led efforts to "fix" Medicare Part B through the <u>Pharmacist Provider Coalition</u> and the <u>Leadership for Medication Management</u>.

But in 2013, after a decade of advocacy work focused on provider status, ACCP's Board of Regents launched a high-profile legislative initiative that focused on establishing coverage for pharmacists' clinical services, not "status" for providers.

ACCP's advocacy strategy now focuses on amending the list of covered services, not covered providers, because Medicare payment is not based on the "recognition" of members of certain health care professions as providers. Medicare payment policy sets out a list of covered tests, items, and services together with the qualifications required for eligibility to render these services.

Let's look at examples of other Medicare-eligible providers. <u>Chiropractors</u> are listed as Medicare providers, but payment is specifically linked to coverage for a defined service: "manual manipulation of the spine if medically necessary to correct a subluxation when provided by a chiropractor or other qualified provider."

That's not to say provider status is unimportant. Efforts at the state level to formalize pharmacists' integration into patient care teams often require a legislative amendment to expand the definition of provider. In California, the successful campaign to define pharmacists as providers and establish the "advanced practice pharmacist" (APP) designation was an important step in this process.

But even according to the California Pharmacists Association (CPhA), obtaining provider status and additional scope of practice was the *first step* for pharmacists to contribute in broader ways to the health care team. Now, CPhA's focus has turned to ensuring that <u>payment</u> systems support pharmacists in these new roles.

ACCP's Medicare Initiative will establish "provider status" for **qualified clinical pharmacists**. Its message is simple: to achieve Medicare's goals of getting the medications right, Congress should pass legislation to establish Medicare Part B coverage for comprehensive medication management provided by qualified clinical pharmacists as members of the patient's health care team. Our goal is to develop sustainable payment mechanisms that include clinical pharmacists in patient care teams. Provider status alone will not achieve this.

ACCP Member Speaks in Minority Health Panel Discussion Hosted by #ThisIsOurShot

#ThisIsOurShot (TIOS) is a national grassroots coalition of health care heroes and allies that aims to build vaccine trust for a COVID-free world and combat misinformation by elevating the voices of health care heroes as trusted messengers through stories, photos, and videos. ACCP partnered with TIOS earlier this year and is actively engaged as a TIOS ally organization. On April 26, 2021, TIOS hosted an online panel discussion for minority health month focused on COVID vaccines. The speakers focused on ways to build vaccine trust in underrepresented minority groups and identified considerations in increasing COVID immunization rates in communities of color. 2021–2022 ACCP-ASHP-VCU Congressional Healthcare Policy Fellow

In July 2021, ACCP's Washington, D.C., team welcomed Tatiana Bujnoch, Pharm.D., M.S., BCPS, to its office as the 2021–2022 <u>American College of Clinical Pharmacy-American Society of Health-System Pharmacists-Virginia Commonwealth University Congressional Healthcare Policy Fellow.</u>

Launched in 2006 under the guidance of ACCP Past President Gary R. Matzke, Pharm.D., FCCP, FCP, the fellow program offers a unique, year-long health care—policy learning experience in the U.S. Congress and the government affairs offices of ACCP and ASHP. The program offers pharmacists an opportunity to gain insight into health care policy analysis and development through immersion in the congressional environment. Fellows are mentored in legislative evaluation, policy development, research, and writing.

Bujnoch earned her Pharm.D. degree from Northeastern University in Boston and her M.S. degree in pharmacy administration and leadership from the University of Houston. Her postgraduate training was in health system pharmacy administration and leadership at Memorial Hermann Health System in Houston. Working as a pharmacist during the pandemic underscored to her the importance of health policy: "I spoke many times with patients who couldn't afford medications or who were afraid they couldn't afford treatment for COVID."

Bujnoch traces her passion for health care policy to her family. She hails from a small town in South Central Texas and is the granddaughter of working-class grandparents without college degrees. Their sacrifices for her family led her to want to make the most of her opportunities, she said.

After the death of her father by suicide during her first year of college, Bujnoch decided to focus on bettering the lives of others. She took on new challenges, including working for 3 months in Jamaica as an assistant in clinics. As she wrote in her application, "Now, I feel the urge to continue to think broader and understand the larger picture, leading me to pursue this fellow program to engage in policy at the national level."

The fellowship, which began in July, consists of 1 week at the Brookings Institution and 3 weeks each with ACCP's and ASHP's government affairs offices. Afterward, Bujnoch will begin her placement within a congressional office or as a member of congressional committee staff in Washington, D.C.

After completing the fellowship, Bujnoch hopes to continue to be engaged in health policy development:

Health issues are important. A devastating health issue can ruin lives. It's a cliche, I know, but it's true: I really just want to help people.

An early draft of the "CURES 2.0" legislation that would create a new agency to develop new treatments for cancer, Alzheimer disease, and other high-profile diseases also proposes Medicare coverage for "genomic precision medicine consultations"—including payment for a "qualified clinical pharmacist." ACCP has held meetings with legislative staff from the lead congressional offices to learn more about this important development and how the College can work with Congress and other key stakeholders to help advance it through the legislative and regulatory process.

This provision, together with growing interest in comprehensive medication management (CMM) at the Medicare Innovation Center, provides further evidence of the growing success of ACCP's strategy to align the profession with high-profile, broadly endorsed, multistakeholder legislative efforts on Capitol Hill. ACCP TO PUBLISH CRITICAL CARE PHARMACOTHERAPY, SECOND EDITION



The second edition of *Critical Care Pharmacotherapy* is scheduled for publication in early 2022. Edited by Brian L. Erstad, Pharm.D., MCCM, FCCP, FASHP, BCPS, and published by ACCP, the new edition updates the textbook's popular first edition. The new edition reflects the latest thinking

and research in critical care, with a look toward the future.

In the preface to the new edition, Erstad writes:

Until recently, the shift in drug discovery and manufacturing from small molecules to biotechnology products has been less influential in critical care than in other practice areas such as oncology, where many new biotechnology approvals (e.g., monoclonal antibody or "mAb" products) continue to change practice. The demand for new COVID-19 therapies has accelerated research on biotechnology drugs for patients in the critical care setting, and novel drug products for other diseases and conditions are likely forthcoming.

First published in 2016, *Critical Care Pharmacotherapy* has now been updated to include new studies, guidelines, and technologies across the spectrum of critical care. Practitioners will find it an indispensable resource when caring for critical care patients.

The new textbook will be available in early 2022 in print and eBook formats from the <u>ACCP Bookstore</u>.
